Reflection for June 23, 2024 the 121th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Today's Gospel passage from Mark 4:35-41 presents us with a powerful narrative that speaks to the storms we face in our lives and the unwavering presence of God amidst them. In this passage, we find Jesus and his disciples crossing the Sea of Galilee. Suddenly, a fierce storm arises, and the waves begin to crash over the boat. The disciples, filled with fear, wake Jesus, who is asleep in the stern, and cry out, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus, unfazed by the storm, rebukes the wind and calms the sea, saying to the disciples, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" This story resonates deeply with the storms we encounter in our own lives. Just as the disciples faced the literal storm on the sea, we too face metaphorical storms times of trial, uncertainty, and fear. These storms can take many forms: illness, loss, financial difficulties, relationship struggles, or any other challenge that rocks our world and threatens to overwhelm us. In the midst of these storms, it's easy to feel like the disciples did-afraid and alone, wondering if God has abandoned us. But this passage reminds us that Jesus is always with us, even in the midst of life's fiercest storms. He may seem asleep at times, but his presence is constant, and his power is limitless. When we cry out to Jesus in the midst of our storms, he hears us. He may not always calm the storm immediately or in the way we expect, but he promises to never leave us or forsake us. And when we allow faith to rise within us, we can experience the peace that surpasses all understanding, knowing that we are held securely in God's loving embrace. So, my dear brothers and sisters, let us take heart in the midst of life's storms. Let us hold fast to our faith, trusting that Jesus is with us always. guiding us through the turbulent waters to the calm shores beyond. And let us never forget the words of Jesus to his disciples: "Peace! Be still!" For in Christ, we find true peace and everlasting hope.

INDULGENCES

What is an Indulgence?

Catholic indulgences are not a thing of the past; they are still part of Catholic doctrine today. They provide remission of punishment for sins, which reduces or eliminates the amount of time that an individual needs to spend in Purgatory after death. The Church's constant teaching should be clear:

Indulgences can be applied only to the punishment that is due for sins already forgiven.

Any Christian who, in a spirit of penitence for sins, asks God for the deeper share in the infinite merits of Jesus Christ that indulgences offer can use them to move ever closer to God — who wants nothing else than for us to be happy with Him forever.

What are some examples of indulgences?

There are two types of indulgences: partial and plenary. A partial indulgence reduces an individual's time in Purgatory, while a plenary indulgence eliminates time in Purgatory completely.

How do Catholic indulgences work?

In the contemporary Catholic Church, an individual can receive a partial or plenary indulgence through acts of prayer, pilgrimages, and other religious actions.

Pope Paul VI reminded us that, because God works through the little things in our lives as well as the great, something as trivial as being stuck in rush-hour traffic can become an opportunity to move closer to God if we offer it up for love of Him.
