### Reflection for July 7, 2024 the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

In today's Gospel, we encounter Jesus returning to His hometown. He enters the synagogue and begins to teach, astonishing those who hear Him. Yet, instead of welcoming His wisdom and acknowledging His mighty works, the people of Nazareth question His authority and scoff at His origins. "Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary?" they ask, blinded by their familiarity with His earthly identity and failing to see the divine wisdom and power within Him. This passage provides us with a profound lesson about the nature of faith and the dangers of familiarity. The people of Nazareth saw Jesus grow up; they knew His family and His humble beginnings. This familiarity bred contempt and skepticism. They could not reconcile the Jesus they knew with the man before them, teaching with wisdom and performing miracles. Their hearts were hardened, and their lack of faith prevented them from experiencing the fullness of God's power through Jesus. Jesus' response is both poignant and instructive: "Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown, and among their own kin, and in their own house." This statement reveals a universal truth about human nature: we often fail to recognize greatness and the work of God in those closest to us. We are quick to dismiss the extraordinary because we are too focused on the ordinary. Reflecting on this, let us examine our own lives. How often do we fail to see the presence of God in our everyday experiences? How often do we overlook the wisdom and gifts of those around us because we think we know them too well? Familiarity can be a double -edged sword—it can bring comfort and closeness, but it can also breed indifference and blindness to the divine working in our midst. This Gospel also challenges us to look inward and ask ourselves about our faith. Do we approach Jesus with a heart full of expectation and trust, or do we let doubts and preconceived notions cloud our vision? Faith is not just about believing in miracles; it's about seeing the hand of God in the mundane, trusting in His presence even when it feels like He is just another carpenter from Nazareth. Jesus' inability to perform many miracles in Nazareth was not due to a lack of power on His part but a lack of faith on theirs. This serves as a stark reminder that our openness to God's grace is crucial. When we open our hearts and minds, we allow God to work wonders in our lives. But when we are closed off, skeptical, and dismissive, we hinder the flow of His grace. May we always remember that Jesus, the carpenter from Nazareth, is also the Son of God, whose wisdom and power know no

### **INDULGENCES**

Continued from last week, June 30th

Anytime that a Catholic in the state of grace performs one of these actions with a contrite heart and with the intention of receiving an indulgence, the Church grants a partial indulgence. How much is a partial indulgence? Only God knows. It's totally up to him. The more devoutly we pray, the more graces we receive.

### PLENARY INDULGENCES

Here are a few examples of some things that a person can do to obtain a plenary indulgence:

- Visit the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration for thirty continuous minutes.
- Devoutly pray the Rosary in a church or public oratory, as a family or in a religious community.
- Devoutly participate in a Eucharist procession, especially on Corpus Christi.
- Spend three entire days in retreat.
- Devoutly participate in the adoration of the Cross at the Good Friday Liturgy.
- Participate in the renewal of baptismal promises during the Easter Vigil.
- Reverently and prayerfully read the Bible for thirty minutes as a means of spiritual reading.

It is important to note, however, that to obtain a plenary indulgence for one of the above specified prayers, there are four other conditions:

- 1. Go to confession several days before or after.
- 2. Receive Holy Communion.
- 3. Pray for the intentions of the Pope (e.g., an Our Father and a Hail Mary for his intentions).
- 4. Be completely detached from all sin, even venial sin.
