Reflection for July 14, 2024 the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Dear brothers and sisters,

Today, we reflect on the Gospel of Mark, chapter 6, verses 7 to 13. In this passage, Jesus sends out the twelve disciples, giving them authority over unclean spirits and instructing them to take nothing for their journey except a staff-no bread, no bag, no money in their belts. They were to wear sandals but not put on two tunics. Jesus said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. And if any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." The disciples went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, anointed with oil many who were sick, and cured them. First, let us consider the act of sending. Jesus does not keep His disciples close to Him for comfort or security. Instead, He sends them out into the world. This sending is a vital part of discipleship. To be a follower of Christ means to be sent into the world, to bring His message of love, repentance, and healing to all we encounter. It is a reminder that our faith is not just for ourselves; it is to be shared. Jesus' instructions to take nothing for their journey except a staff highlight the importance of reliance on God. In a world where we often seek security in material possessions, Jesus calls us to trust in divine providence. The disciples were to depend on the hospitality of others and, more importantly, on God's provision. This radical dependence on God challenges us to examine where we place our trust. Do we trust in our resources, our abilities, or do we place our trust in God's faithful provision? The instruction to shake off the dust from their feet if they are not welcomed is a powerful one. It teaches us that while we are called to share the Good News with everyone, we will not always be received warmly. Rejection is a part of the journey. When faced with rejection, Jesus advises us to move on, not carrying the burden of that rejection with us. This is a lesson in resilience and perseverance. We are to continue our mission with the same zeal and love, regardless of the obstacles we face. The actions of the disciplesproclaiming repentance, casting out demons, anointing the sick, and healing-underscore the holistic nature of Jesus' ministry. The message of repentance is central to our faith, calling us to turn away from sin and turn towards God. The casting out of demons and healing of the sick demonstrate the power of God's kingdom breaking into the world, restoring wholeness and peace. As we reflect on this passage, let

CEMETERY UPDATE: Now that the roads have been completed, please clean up your plots. Your assistance is greatly appreciated. Anything left on the ground will be disposed of. Please follow the posted rules - if you would like a copy we have them at the Parish Office. A portion of the rules is listed below; if you have any questions or need clarification please contact the Parish Office at (518) 237-5151. The rules and regulations for our cemetery are in accordance with the Albany Diocesan Cemeteries.

Permitted:

- Artificial floral pieces on monuments only.
- Potted Plants on the base of the monument.
- Flags will be allowed on graves sites for one month (30 days) following Memorial Day.
- Flush Markers: All Flush Markers shall be set so that the top is flush or level with the ground. This includes Family and Military Markers.

Not Permitted:

- The planting of trees, shrubs or flowers on any lot or grave, including artificial flowers.
- Existing trees or shrubs that are not maintained or are overgrown will be removed by the owner or will be removed by the cemetery at the owner's expense.
- Urns and flower boxes.
- ° Glass items, statues, and plastic ornaments.
- Stone, marble or wood chips.

LIGHTING A CANDLE FOR A LOVED ONE: Candles are very powerful in our faith. We light a candle for someone we love, to remember a loved one we miss, for someone who needs our prayers, etc. It can be something that really connects us with God. We invite you to light an electric votive candle at St. Michael's Church, spend a moment with our Lord (red candles) and our Lady (blue candles), and say a prayer. If you wish to find out more about our Electric Candles donations please call or stop by the parish office. Instructions also are on the donation box with the candles.



AN ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

For those who may be unable to attend Mass (or for whatever reason cannot normally receive Holy Communion) the Church has an ancient practice known as 'Spiritual Communion'.

A Spiritual Communion is different from an actual or Sacramental Communion, in which we receive the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

To make a Spiritual Communion is to make a 'Communion of desire', when receiving the Lord in Holy Communion is not possible.

Pope St. John Paul II was a great advocate of spiritual communion. He wrote in his encyclical Ecclesia de Eucharitia: "It is good to cultivate in our hearts a constant desire for the Sacrament of the Eucharist". This was the origin of the practice of 'Spiritual Communion,' which has happily been established in the Church for centuries and recommended by saints who were masters of the spiritual life. St. Teresa of Jesus wrote: 'When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." The Church recommends making spiritual communions as often as possible, even if we are still able to participate in Mass that day. There are many prayers that can be used to make a Spiritual Communion and to stir up a holy desire for that union with Jesus, but perhaps the most famous is the one written by St. Alphonsus.

Act of Spiritual Communion by St. Alphonsus Liguori

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Prayer before a Crucifix

On each of the Fridays of Lent, a plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who, after Communion, recite the "Prayer Before a Crucifix": Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus while before Thy face I humbly kneel and, with burning soul, pray and beseech Thee to fix deep in my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope and charity; true contrition for my sins; and a firm purpose of amendment; while I contemplate with great love and tender pity Thy five most precious wounds, pondering over them within me while I call to mind the words which David Thy prophet said of Thee, my Jesus: "They have pierced My hands and My feet, they have numbered all My bones. Amen.
